We are pleased to inform you that the U.S. Board on Geographic Names, at its July 14, 2011 meeting, approved the proposal to apply the new name Hog Hollow Crater to a crater in Fremont County. The name has been entered into the Geographic Names Information System, the nation's official geographic names repository, which is available and searchable online at <http://geonames.usgs.gov>. The entry reads as follows:

**Hog Hollow Crater:** crater; approx. 327 acres; located 7.2 km (4.5 mi) NW of Linderman Dam on the Teton River, 17 km (11 mi) E of Saint Anthony; named in association with nearby Hog Hollow; Fremont County, Idaho; Secs 35& 36, T8N, R42E and Sec 1, T7N, R42E, Boise Meridian; 43°58'14"N, 111°27'13"W; USGS map – Linderman Dam 1:24,000.
